

Rules of Third 1: Grid Lines





Rules of Third 2: Thirds of Frame

Rules of Third 3: Three Items







Shrubs, Flowers

- Throw primary subject off-center
 - one plant
 - a cluster of them
 - or an entire shrub/tree
- Leave negative space (breathing room)
- May include a few more individuals, but not as large/ dominant in the frame
- Incorporate the background habitat
- Level the horizon






Close-ups


Subject dominates the frame


- Ok to place in-center
- Ok if a few other flowers are partially included
- Must be very sharply focused, OR focus only on a tiny piece
- Reproductive parts are extremely important!



Scenics

- Throw primary subject off-center
- Leave negative space (breathing room): sky, water, beach
- May include a few more objects of interest, but not as large as the primary subject
- Avoid overly bright and/or unwanted objects
 - Attention goes to the brightest object
 - Squint test
- Level the horizon






Animals in habitat

- Throw primary subject off-center
- Don't cut off wings, tails, beak, antlers, etc.
- Leave negative space (breathing room)
- Align motion and/or their face into the center
- Level the horizon



Animal Close-ups


Subject does not totally dominate

- Throw primary subject off-center
- Cleanly exclude body parts
 - Totally include/exclude entire feet/paws/ears
 - Don't cut off mid-digit
 - Leave negative space (breathing room)
- Align motion and/or face into the center
- Focus on the eye
- Level the horizon



Verticals

- All the same techniques & rules apply
- 75% of all published photos are verticals
- Shoot some horizontal, some vertical






Light values: stops Human eye: 12 stops Cameras: 5 stops


- Use histogram

- If needed:

 - Diffuse white tones
 - Neutral Density Filter






- Southern California Wildflowers
- Categories
 - Nature Open: flower(s) + mostly natural. Native flowers encouraged. Garden species of flowers and man-made items are allowed. Non-native weeds are not allowed (foreign mustards & thistles, etc).
 - Flower & man: flower + person or something man-made.
 Beautiful, artistic, and/or whimsical images are encouraged.
 - Nature Strict: No "hand of man". The image contains a native flower(s) photographed in the wild. Absolutely no hint of humans or anything man-made. No non-natives.
